### Investment Objective

The objective of the Fund is to provide investors with a strategy that delivers strong positive returns when global equity markets experience material declines and volatility is high and costs comparable to, or less than other systematic derivative based hedging strategies such as rolling puts. The Fund aims to have a negative beta to equity markets. The nature of the strategy is expected to experience a degree of loss during periods when equity markets rise and experience low volatility. It is therefore intended to mitigate other investment exposures an investor may have in their overall portfolio. Invested capital is at risk and there is no guarantee that the objective will be attained over any time period. The Fund is actively managed and no benchmark is used for performance comparison or portfolio construction.

### Sub-Advisor and Strategy Overview

The Fund is managed by the Aberdeen Alternatives team which has over 25 years' experience in alternative investments. The ASI Global Risk Mitigation index has been live since July 2019, with the Fund launching in June 2022.

The Fund, indirectly through its investment in a swap referencing the ASI Global Risk Mitigation index will pursue a multi-strategy and multi-asset approach implemented across a range of quantitative investment strategies (the "GRM Portfolio") to deliver the investment objective described above.

#### **Investment Thesis**

The GRM Strategies to which the Fund will seek to gain exposure are: First Risk Strategies, Defensive Factors, Systematic Trend Following Strategies and Tail Risk Strategies. The allocations to the systematic investment strategies within the GRM Portfolio are determined by using a combination of quantitative portfolio construction methodologies and qualitative assessments, which together are intended to deliver a robust negative correlation profile to equities while allowing for added value from dynamic asset allocation.

June saw a broad-based easing of financial conditions with both bonds and equities rallying and the US dollar weakening versus both developed and emerging market currencies. Economic data for the period showed a modest softening of economic conditions in the US, consistent with a slowdown in the economy, but not an outright contraction. The May jobs report showed that payroll numbers were still increasing at a steady pace and the unemployment rate remained stable. While the future impact of tariffs on inflation remains unclear, the data boosted hopes that a soft landing for the economy with a further gradual easing of monetary policy could still be achieved. The MSCI World, the S&P 500, and the Nasdaq all ended the month at new record all-time highs. Commodity markets however were volatile in the wake of Israel and the United States launching attacks against Iran's nuclear enrichment facilities. The price of Brent crude rose briefly from \$65 a barrel to almost \$80 before falling back again, once it became clear that Iranian oil export facilities were not being targeted, and that the Iranian regime was unlikely to follow through on threats to close the Straits of Hormuz. Despite the geopolitical headlines, equity markets remained becalmed with realised volatility over the month of June averaging around 10. Measures of implied volatility across equities, rates, and currencies all declined.

The GRM strategy had a negative return for June driven by the First Risk strategies. The rest of the portfolio was broadly flat with gains on Defensive Factor strategies offset by modest losses on Trend and Tail Risk strategies. Within First Risk most of the losses came from Index Puts and 1-year implied volatility, but there were small gains on the recently established 30-year Treasury futures position. Defensive Factors had positive performance in Commodity Backwardation (steepening backwardation in energy futures curves) and Interest Rate Volaitlity strategies in Europe. Trend strategies had gains in currencies (short USD) and Credit (long) but losses on commodities (short energy) and interest rates. The Tail Risk strategies had little impact on performance with no individual strategy making a contribution greater than 10 basis points.

#### Derivative usage

The Fund will make extensive use of total return swaps to reduce risk, reduce cost and / or generate growth consistent with the Fund's risk profile, if market prices are expected to rise ('long positions') or fall ('short positions').

The strategies that the Total Return Swap reference may themselves have high notional leverage as a result of the exposure to derivatives.

The use of leverage in the underlying reference indices increases the risk of potential increased losses or returns compared to unleveraged indices.








